

Eden Camp Modern History Museum is a valuable educational resource which brings history to life for pupils from KS2 onwards and meets the requirements of the National Curriculum in all subjects.

Here is all you need to know about your visit:

Accessibility

Our wheelchair friendly site is mostly flat with ramps in place where needed. Wheelchairs (self-propelled) are available to borrow from Reception.

Braille sheets available on request.

Our exhibitions offer a multi-sensory experience and, in some circumstances, a 'hands on' display can be organised for individuals and small groups. Please note, some of our exhibitions utilise flashing/strobe lights and smoke effects.

Facilities

Toilet facilities (including dedicated disabled) are located in the centre of site.

Ample onsite free coach parking.

Mess huts are allocated on booking for 30 min slots for groups to eat packed lunches. Alternatively, we have a set menu available in our Café and plenty of outdoor seating.

Puppet Show

A pre-recorded film lasting approx 15 mins is on loop in our Music Hall (hut 6). This can be viewed at any time of the day, and includes our traditional puppet show along with a sing-a-long with Vera Lynn.

Gift Shop

Our shop has gifts and souvenirs to suit all budgets. If you don't wish to visit the gift shop, goody bags can be made in advance and to a budget.

Junior Assault Course

Our wooden, outdoor play area for under 12s complete with towers, escape tunnels, slides and other obstacles, is great for burning off energy before the coach journey home. Assault course may be closed during periods of wet or damp weather. We have also developed a brand new junior play area for under 5s which is suitable for reception classes.

Example Itinerary

Allowing 4 hours for a visit.

On arrival (from 10am onwards) group leaders should call in at Reception to collect maps and gather information for the day.
